Dear President Haile:

At its meeting on October 22, 2021, the Joint Review Committee on Educational Programs in Nuclear Medicine Technology (JRCNMT) evaluated the self-study and letter of site visit findings of the nuclear medicine technology program at Broward College North Campus. It was determined that the program is in compliance with all standards but is deficient in meeting a critical student outcome benchmark. The program's accreditation was continued for seven years, the maximum period, but a progress report is required.

As part of the comprehensive program review process, an assessment of all clinical affiliates determined that a maximum capacity of 15 students can be accommodated in the clinical education portion of the program. The following institutions are recognized as the program's affiliates:


The program must submit a completed Pass Rate Progress Report (email attachment) no later than **February 15, 2022**. The JRCNMT's benchmark for graduate pass rate for first-time examinees on the national certification exams is 80% or higher for a rolling three-year period. The program's current pass rate for 2018-2020 is 68%. The JRCNMT will review the report in April 2022 and provide the program with feedback. This outcome will continue to be monitored through the Annual Report process to ensure the program demonstrates improvement over successive years and reaches the minimum threshold. Failure to demonstrate improvement in the pass rate over time may result in the program being placed on probation. Since probation is limited to a period of no more than two years, accreditation may eventually be withdrawn if the minimum threshold benchmark is not met.

The program's next review for continued accreditation will occur in 2028 and a mid-cycle report must be submitted in August 2025.

Notification of this decision will be forwarded to the academic institution's accrediting agency and will also be made available to the public through the JRCNMT website and its publications.

The JRCNMT extends best wishes for continued success of this program.
