In 2018 the nuclear medicine technology program at Vanderbilt University Medical Center was placed on probation for one year by the Joint Review Committee on Educational Programs in Nuclear Medicine Technology (JRCNMT). Removal of probation and extension of accreditation to the full term was contingent upon submission of a progress report and completion of a focused on-site evaluation that indicated the deficiencies in compliance with published accreditation standards had been satisfactorily addressed.


Based on the information provided in the progress report and focused evaluation report, the JRCNMT voted on October 25, 2019 to remove the program from probation and extend accreditation six years. The program was also removed from heightened monitoring of its certification exam pass rates.

The next evaluation of the program for continued accreditation will occur in 2025. A mid-cycle report will be requested in 2022.

Notification of this decision will be forwarded to the institution's accrediting agency. The information will also be made available to the public on the JRCNMT website.
