Notice of Accreditation Actions

Spring 2017

Accrediting agencies recognized by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation are required to notify the public of accreditation decisions and the basis for such decisions. The Joint Review Committee on Educational Programs in Nuclear Medicine Technology (JRCNMT) meets this requirement by publishing a notice of accreditation actions on its website within 30 business days after each board meeting. The nuclear medicine technology community, regional and specialized accrediting agencies, and state agencies responsible for postsecondary education and radiation oversight are notified when a new notice of action is published.

At its meeting on April 7 - 8, 2017 the JRCNMT took the following actions regarding the nuclear medicine technology programs sponsored by the institutions listed below. Specific standards listed in this report can be reviewed in the JRCNMT Accreditation Standards for Nuclear Medicine Technologist Education.

Continued Accreditation - Programs in this category have completed a self-study and on-site evaluation. The term for continued accreditation is a maximum of seven years.

Augusta University (GA)

Continued accreditation conferred to December 31, 2024 Program in compliance with all JRCNMT Standards

University of Iowa Hospitals & Clinics (IA)

Continued accreditation conferred to December 31, 2020 Progress Report due February 1, 2018 addressing Standards A1.3b, B2.1a and E1.3

Molloy College (NY)

Continued accreditation conferred to December 31, 2024 Program in compliance with all JRCNMT Standards

Accreditation Extended- Programs in this category have submitted an interim report demonstrating compliance has been achieved on previously cited standards, allowing extension of the previous accreditation award up to a maximum of seven years.

Frederick Community College (MD)

Accreditation extended one year; accreditation conferred through December 31, 2019 Progress Report due August 1, 2017 addressing Standard C2.4e

Manhattan College (NY)

Accreditation extended one year; accreditation conferred through December 31, 2018 Mid-cycle report due August 1, 2018

Initial Accreditation - Programs in this category have completed a self-study and on-site evaluation. The term for initial accreditation is up to three years.

Stony Brook University (NY)

Initial accreditation conferred for one year, to December 31, 2018 Progress Report due August 1, 2017 addressing Standards C1.1, C1.2 and E1.3

Voluntary Withdrawal of Accreditation - This action is taken at the request of an accredited program.

Bluegrass Community & Technical College (KY)

Voluntary withdrawal of accreditation due to program closure, effective June 30, 2017

University of Nebraska Medical Center (NE)

Voluntary withdrawal of accreditation due to program closure, effective February 9, 2017

Johnston Community College (NC)

Voluntary withdrawal of accreditation due to program closure, effective May 31, 2017

UPMC Jameson Health (PA)

Voluntary withdrawal of accreditation due to program closure, effective October 24, 2016

Del Mar College (TX)

Voluntary withdrawal of accreditation due to program closure, effective August 16, 2017

Active/Inactive Program Status - Inactive status is granted when a program has no students currently enrolled. Inactive status is limited to a two-year period. Reactivation is granted when a program submits a report indicating the program continues to be in substantial compliance with accreditation standards and enrolls students.
