Joint Review Committee on Educational Programs in Nuclear Medicine Technology

Notice of Accreditation Actions

Spring 2019

Accrediting agencies recognized by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation are required to notify the public of accreditation decisions and the basis for such decisions. The Joint Review Committee on Educational Programs in Nuclear Medicine Technology (JRCNMT) meets this requirement by publishing a notice of accreditation actions on its website within 30 business days after each board meeting. Beginning in June 2019 the JRCNMT will also post program's accreditation letters in the online directory of accredited programs. The nuclear medicine technology community, regional and specialized accrediting agencies, and state agencies responsible for postsecondary education and radiation oversight are notified when a new notice of action is published.

At its meeting on April 26 - 27, 2019 the JRCNMT took the following actions regarding the nuclear medicine technology programs sponsored by the institutions listed below. Specific standards listed in this report can be reviewed in the JRCNMT Accreditation Standards for Nuclear Medicine Technologist Education.

Accreditation Extended- Programs in this category have submitted an interim report demonstrating compliance has been achieved on previously cited standards, allowing extension of the previous accreditation award up to a maximum of seven years.

Salem State University (MA)

Accreditation is extended five years. Accreditation is conferred through December 31, 2025, with a mid-cycle report due in 2022.

University of Utah Hospital (UT)

Accreditation is extended five years. Accreditation is conferred through December 31, 2024, with a mid-cycle report due in 2021.

Aurora St. Luke's Medical Center (WI)

Accreditation is extended five years. Accreditation is conferred through December 31, 2025, with a mid-cycle report due in 2022.

Initial Accreditation - Programs in this category have completed a self-study and on-site evaluation. The term for initial accreditation is a maximum of three years.

Miami Dade College (FL)

Initial accreditation conferred for one year, to December 31, 2019

A Progress Report is due August 1, 2019 addressing Standard C2.2s

Probation Removed - Programs in this category have submitted an interim report demonstrating compliance has been achieved on previously cited standards that resulted in probation.

Loma Linda University (CA)

Probation removed. The program's regular mid-cycle report is due by August 2019.

Triton College (IL)

Probation removed. The program's regular mid-cycle report is due by August 2019.

Voluntary Withdrawal of Accreditation - This action is taken at the request of an accredited program.

Frederick Community College (MD)

Voluntary withdrawal of accreditation due to program closure, effective December 1, 2018

University of Vermont (VT)

Voluntary withdrawal of accreditation due to program closure, effective May 31, 2019

Substantive Change Requests

Saint Louis University (MO)

Approved: changing the clinical contact hour to credit hour ratio and compressing curriculum to move graduation to May.

Rowan College at Gloucester County (NJ)

Approved: revision of curriculum and reduction of credit hours to meet state limit of 60 credit hours for an associate degree.

Amarillo College (TX)

Approved: changing the program's designated physics prerequisite course which will permit more clinical education contact hours.
