Notice of Accreditation Actions

Spring 2022 - Revised

Accrediting agencies recognized by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA) must notify the public of accreditation decisions and the basis for such decisions. The nuclear medicine technology community, regional and specialized accrediting agencies, and state agencies responsible for postsecondary education and radiation oversight are notified when a new notice of action is published.

The Joint Review Committee on Educational Programs in Nuclear Medicine Technology (JRCNMT) meets this requirement by publishing a notice of accreditation actions on its website within 30 business days after each board meeting. Additional detail on board actions is found in the specific program's accreditation letter, posted in the <u>Directory of Accredited Programs</u> on the JRCNMT's website.

At its regular meeting on April 8-9, 2022, and at a special meeting on April 25, 2022 the JRCNMT took the following actions regarding the nuclear medicine technology programs sponsored by the institutions listed below. Specific standards listed in this report can be reviewed in the <u>JRCNMT Accreditation Standards for Nuclear Medicine Technologist Education</u>.

Accreditation Continued – These programs were reviewed for continuing accreditation in 2021 but were not in compliance with all JRCNMT accreditation standards. Based on submission of a satisfactory progress report in 2022, these programs received Continued Accreditation.

Prince George's Community College (MD)

Continued accreditation 6 years

Ferris State University (MI)

Continued Accreditation 6 years

Voluntary Withdrawal of Accreditation - This action is taken at the request of an accredited program.

Manhattan College (NY)

Voluntary withdrawal of accreditation, effective May 30, 2022.

Caldwell Community College and Technical Institute (NC)

Voluntary withdrawal of accreditation, effective May 31, 2022.

Substantive Change Requests

GateWay Community College (AZ)

Approved: change in program-level student learning outcomes and revised terminology for courses designated as prerequisites to program admission.

Rhode Island Hospital (RI)

Approved: change in program-level student learning outcomes.

Active/Inactive Program Status - Inactive status is granted when a program has no students currently enrolled. This status is limited to a two-year period. Reactivation is granted when a program submits a report documenting continued compliance with accreditation standards and plans to begin enrolling students.

Pennsylvania College of Health Sciences (PA)

Approved: program request to rescind prior notice of inactive status that was to take effect in fall 2022.
