Dear Dr. Madison:

At its meeting on October 29, 2020, the Joint Review Committee on Educational Programs in Nuclear Medicine Technology (JRCNMT) reviewed the nuclear medicine technology program at Tarrant County College – Trinity River East Campus for initial accreditation. The review included consideration of the program’s self-study, the letter of site visit findings provided to the program and the progress report submitted by the program in August 2020 after initial accreditation was deferred in April.

The Board voted to grant the nuclear medicine technology program initial accreditation for a period of three (3) years, which is the maximum amount of time for a new program at this stage in the process.

A mid-cycle report addressing the status of the program will be due August 1, 2023. After evaluation of the report, the JRCNMT may extend accreditation two additional years to the full five-year period for initial accreditation. If deficiencies are noted, extension of accreditation may be deferred and a progress report addressing the areas of concern will be requested.

Accreditation is awarded on the condition that the individual affiliate capacities and the total student capacity in the clinical phase of the program, as noted in the table on the next page, are not exceeded. The table also identifies the program’s recognized affiliates.

Student capacity at affiliates is based on equipment, staffing levels and volume of procedures performed, as noted in the self-study and during the site visit. “Arranged (arr)” means students are assigned to the facility for special rotations, but the capacity is not included in the calculation of the program’s total clinical student capacity. Where clinical affiliates are shared with other educational programs, it is the responsibility of the program directors to ensure clinical assignments do not exceed the approved capacity at these affiliates.


