Dear Dr. Hopkins:

At its meeting on October 13, 2023, the Joint Review Committee on Educational Programs in Nuclear Medicine Technology (JRCNMT) voted to confer continued accreditation for seven years to the nuclear medicine technology program at Baptist Health Sciences University. This decision was based on the fact that review of the self-study, the letter of site visit findings and the program's response to the findings indicated that the program is in substantial compliance with JRCNMT accreditation standards.

The program's next review for continued accreditation will occur in 2030. A mid-cycle report will be requested in 2027.

This award is made on the condition that the number of students enrolled in the clinical phase of the program shall not exceed 16. The program's recognized affiliates and their respective student capacities are identified on the page attached to this letter.

Notification of this decision will be forwarded to the institution's accrediting agency and will also be made available to the public through the JRCNMT website and its publications.
