Dear Dr. Madison:

On October 29, 2020, the nuclear medicine technology program at Tarrant County College – Trinity River East Campus received initial accreditation from the Joint Review Committee on Educational Programs in Nuclear Medicine Technology (JRCNMT) for a period of three years. Extension of initial accreditation to the full five-year term may occur after submission of a satisfactory mid-cycle report during the third year of the initial accreditation period.


The mid-cycle report submitted by the nuclear medicine technology program in August demonstrated satisfactory compliance with the standards comprising the report, which are a subset of those within the *Accreditation Standards for Nuclear Medicine Technologist Education*. Accordingly, the JRCNMT accepted the report and extended accreditation two additional years at its meeting last week. The program's next review for continued accreditation is scheduled to occur in 2025.

Notification of this decision will be forwarded to the institution's accrediting agency. The information will also be made available to the public through the JRCNMT website and publications.

As part of the mid-cycle review, new clinical affiliate data was analyzed and the student capacity at each affiliate was evaluated. The table on the attached page indicates the current student capacity at each affiliate along with the program's total clinical education capacity.

The JRCNMT extends best wishes for continued success in the operation and further development of this program.

Arranged capacities are not included in the calculation of a program's total clinical student capacity.
